BLUEBILLS AT THE FAIR



In line with our objective to build a larger and more robust organization through—out the Olympic Peninsula, we held a meeting in Sequim to recognize the achievements of these members, to describe the programs we have and volunteer opportunities and to recruit new members from the area.

Here is what has been going on in Clallam County: Builders: Since January 2013 through July 2015:

Ramps	49
Grab bars	69
Railings and steps	39
Miscellaneous	38

World Vision Program:

Each quarter members drive about 800 miles and contribute 90 volunteer hoursdelivering goods to 18 agencies, schools and churches in Clallam County.

Week-End School Feeding Program

Bluebills started this program in the fall of 2014 with \$600 and ten selected students. With the help of others in the community, in the fall of 2015 they plan to feed over 100 students each week—end.

Electrical/Electronic Goods Recycling

This program provides a drop-off point for items no longer wanted. Larger items will be picked up. The purpose is to raise funds for World Vision memberships.

In 2014 they raised over \$1200, in 2015, over \$2200. A stand—out effort and a lot of work by our members. The "pienie-type" meeting was attended by about 25 people.

All agreed it was a great chance to find out about our programs and to get to know each other.





DELIVERY OF WORLD VISION SCHOOL SUPPLIES

World Vision has a program to provide school supplies to schools with over 75% of the kids on free or reduced-price meals. In our area there are 14 schools who qualify. Because these schools would find it difficult to get to Fife to actually pick up supplies, we are allowed to act for them. The supplies are donated by Yobi, who provide a box with enough items for an elementary

class of 30 students. We have received 168 boxes. In theory, enough beginning school supplies for 5040 students. We will be distributing these supplies starting September 11. They go they go to schools in Shelton, Bremerton, Neah and Clallam Bay and Queets. Our effort? A round trip to Queets from our storehouse in Port Ludlow is over 300 miles.

Thanks to all the folks who made the pickup and helped unload. Then, thanks to all those who delivered these supplies to the schools.










