

Jumping Mouse Project Chapter 2

Last year, Bluebills built a cabinet for Jumping Mouse Children's Center (see the <u>August</u> and <u>September</u> 2021 Flyers). It was put in the Chimacum Elementary School for use by Jumping Mouse therapists in helping children with learning disabilities. Because of its usefulness in providing therapy to children in Chimacum, Jumping Mouse therapists requested two more cabinets—one for Quilcene and one for Brinnon. Bluebills completed the two additional cabinets and they were picked up by Jean Scarboro (in picture with loaded cabinets). Project was done by Joe Gagnier, Richard Myers and Dave Parrish.

S.O.S. - Poulsbo Mobile Home Park Update

The previous addition of the *Flyer* reported on a low income mobile home park that had been bought up by an out-of-state investment corporation, and that long term residents were facing eviction if they do not meet unachievable goals of upgrades.

Poulsbo Mobile Home Park provides essential housing for hundreds of families and children, valued hard-working members of the community. Most of the 76 mobile home sites are occupied by multiple residents, many extended, multi-generational families, predominantly low-income Latinos, and primarily Spanish speaking.

Bluebills recently met with the on-site managers to discuss our role in providing handyman services. They were given a handful our Independent Living Program flyers and will make them available to tenants who are in need.

We were able to track down the elderly woman, cited in last month's article, who had returned home from the hospital after having suffered a stroke and heart attack, only to learn that she was facing a deadline to make significant exterior repairs. She will need a lot of work done on her home. We thought that the gaping hole in one of the interior floors would be the top priority, and the first thing to fix, but she said no, she wants the exterior repairs done first, and to have the worry of eviction removed.

Other residents have noticed our presence and Bluebills are reaching out to them as well.
