On October 30, the PSO Bluebills board held a meeting to discuss what all our different groups are doing, below is a summary of what is happening.

World Vision Essential Supplies Program: we are currently receiving approximately 3 pallets of goods each month. Most of the items are things that people living outside could use. (tents, canopies, camp chairs, sleeping bags, cook stoves, etc.). No household items, personal care items, diapers etc. All diapers are currently going to Maui for the fire victims. Everything we receive is taken by our agencies each month and they are very thankful. Mike Burke went down and toured the warehouse in Fife last Tuesday. The pickings are very slim, but they try to give us as much as they can. We are in verbal contact with both the warehouse supervisor and program coordinator each month.

PENINSULA SUPPORT ORGANIZATION (PSO) TREASURER'S REPORT 3rd Ouarter 2023

This report is for the period June through September 2023. We have \$31,205.30 in cash, net of uncashed checks. That is a decrease of \$3,344.47. However, we do have a \$5,287 receivable from the City of Poulsbo that should be paid in October 2023. Here is the breakdown by Fund:

Unrestricted fund

The increase of \$190 is from the Dove Hose reimbursing us for the 2nd quarter PL storage unit (\$210) offset by \$20 for the filing fee for our annual report to the Secretary of State's office. We received no revenue for this fund.

STEM fund

The increase of \$480 is due to the collection for school supplies which will be transmitted to Chimacum schools in October.

Jefferson Builders fund

The decrease of \$1,125 is due to the cost of insurance for the builders (\$677), ramp material (\$375), and the builders' warehouse, (\$450) offset by donations received by the Jefferson Builders, \$347.

Kitsap Builders fund

The decrease of \$2890 is due to the cost of insurance for the builders (\$677), material for ramps (\$2,158), and spending for supplies and material for the PMHC project, (\$15,071), being greater than donations (\$3672) and reimbursement received from the City of Poulsbo (\$2,526) and Kitsap County (\$7215) for the PMHC project, and the normal donations (\$650) receive during the quarter. This decrease will be offset by the receivable of \$5,287 due from the City of Poulsbo.

Repair and Renovation Work at Poulsbo Manufactured Homes Community Wrapped Up for This Season

The volunteer effort to repair and restore mobile homes in critical need within the Poulsbo Manufactured Homes Community (formerly "Poulsbo Mobile Home Park") wrapped up for this construction season, with plans to resume in the spring of 2024. Under the leadership of the Peninsula Support Organization Bluebills, 60+ community volunteers and caring neighbors put in a remarkable 2150 hours of volunteer labor, between June 27 and October 7, 2023.

In addition to park-wide cleanup, ten mobile home units, housing 25-30 individuals and extended families, seniors and disabled individuals, were identified in most need and the focus of this initial volunteer effort. Repairs included the full gamut for home repair. Plumbing got repaired, siding got replaced, windows were replaced, rot in every possible location was removed and repaired. Rain gutter systems were restored to working order; stairs, ramps, and porches were made safe; overgrown landscape got trimmed; and houses got a fresh coat of paint.

Materials were funded from grants provided by the City of Poulsbo, Kitsap Community Resources, and private donations. Additional generous "behind the scenes," support included organizational and financial assistance, plus skilled professionals, not to mention many providing hearty lunches for the volunteer repair teams. Special thanks to the: Poulsbo Rotary Club, St. Vincent de Paul Society, Church of Jesus Christ of the Latter-Day Saints, Seventh-Day Adventist Church, Poulsbo City Public Works and Kitsap Immigrant Assistance Center, Supreme Plumbing, Moran's Painting, Poulsbo Westside Pizza, and Coast Do It Best Hardware. Final thanks to Lisa deFaria, for offering her amazing list of contacts in the community, keeping the myriad people and agencies informed, and offering guidance throughout the entire program.

Poulsbo Manufactured Homes Community has historically provided affordable housing for up to 350 low-income residents. Despite the tremendous effort to repair the worst homes and those with the greatest need, additional units remain in need of repair. Repair costs are often well beyond the means of most residents. Even though the official 2023 season is over, Bluebills will continue to offer support and services to individuals throughout the off-season.


