Note From the Vice Chair

Are the Bluebills a first line of defense, or a last line of defense when it comes to protecting the independent living of elderly, handicapped, and disadvantaged persons?

Historically, we have been more of a first line of defense, with our independent living efforts focused on fall prevention and accessibility. It costs about \$20 for a grab bar, whereas a fall in the bathroom, a broken hip, emergency response, hospitalization, and rehab costs a whole lot more.

As mentioned in the October Flyer article, "Bluebills Mobile Home Park Outreach," Jeff Young explained how our mission of helping people live independently in their homes has been expanded to include keeping people from losing their homes.

On October 17, Bluebills took a Kitsap Sun reporter and photographer on a half-day tour of 4 low-income mobile home parks in south and central Kitsap where residents are under increasing threat of eviction by large investment companies who have been buying up these parks. Many sad and disturbing stories were told by our clients, and we were able to show what Bluebills are doing as a last line of defense to help them from becoming homeless. Kitsap Sun ran the story in their Thanksgiving day edition, including a photo of David Negrones, Bluebills volunteer handyman, who celebrated his 88th birthday by showing up wearing his toolbelt for a work day at Pinewood Mobile Home Park in Bremerton.

Whether it's the first, last, or only line of defense, Bluebills are often the go-to place for those in need when they're out of other options.



"Half the clients can afford nothing for materials, so we do a lot of salvaging, repurposing. Just anytime Home Depot has sales on lumber... we go and grab it all up. We do get some donations and we beg, borrow and steal."


Local School Hosts Western Regional Robotics Competition

Bomb Cyclone be damned--John Fillers and Glen Bell committed to our ramp build even with the weather forecast. Yes, there was heavy rain and wind on and off during the day. Our client needed her existing ramp that was too steep and had history of her falling on it to be replaced with a ramp with a more gradual slope and handrails. Our client was able to contribute for part of the cost and Bluebills contributed for most of the cost of the materials. Even though John and Glen had to move stacked firewood to make room for ramp posts and rails, they were able to get the ramp built in one day. Bluebills normally has 4-5 builders participating on ramp projects like this. They obviously worked hard and fast to get the job done, and they did it maintaining our high standards of workmanship. Our client was elated with her new ramp and said she feels more safe when leaving and entering her home. - Dave Parrish
